This week in school we have been focusing on **Article 13** of the Convention on the Rights of a Child: 'Every child must be free to say what they think and to see and receive all kinds of information, as long as it is within the law.'

Bad Weather?

Please can we remind all parents that information about bad weather can be found on the Cornwall County website as well as our own. If the weather is too bad a text with information will be send out to you before school. We may decide to close breakfast club, open late or close the school. However, you will be informed by text. We always aim to remain open as we know bad weather can be an inconvenience.

Gifted and Able Science Workshop

A science gifted and able workshop took place at the end of the autumn term to provide intellectual challenges, to maximise the learning opportunities for a group of pupils, extending and developing their scientific investigative skills.

Kitchen Chemistry!

First we made saturated solutions of Magnesium Sulphate (Epsom Salts). We used warm water, to speed up the dissolving. We then used cotton wool to paint images onto black card, using the solution. When we dried the images with the hairdryer, the water evaporated, leaving behind crystals of the Magnesium Sulphate. We then extend this to use the solutions to grow larger crystals in the classroom.

Soap Boats

Our next experiment was to investigate the effect of soap on water. We made a simple V-shaped 'boat' which floated on a tray of water. We dripped liquid soap into the V of the boat – the boat then moved forward. This was because the soap broke the skin of the water, pushing the card. We had great fun!!





Investigation to determine the best material to use to line a box for a hibernating mammal e.g. tortoise or hedgehog

This was an open ended investigation with pupils shown a range of materials e.g. shredded newspaper, bubblewrap, fabric, leaves, and foil. Pupils had a container, small water bottle filled with warm water, a stop watch and digital thermometer to use to conduct the experiment. We discussed how we could find out which would be the best material, how we could keep the test fair and engaged in a frank discussion around the potential of the different materials to keep a mammal warm, making a simple hypothesis. Each pupil selected a material and wrapped it around their water bottle. The pupils decided to check the water temperature ever 5 minutes and recorded their result on the flip chart. At the end of the investigation, pupils were able to draw conclusions and report on their results. Each pupil was able to complete a simple investigation report using a rage of investigative skills. The pupils demonstrated creativity, task-commitment and motivation throughout the activity and enjoyed the challenge.





What's happening next!

Once an area of the curriculum is identified for a gifted and able enrichment activity, teacher's select learners who are demonstrating performance or potential for higher ability performance in academic, creative, leadership or artistic domains when compared with their peers. We have identified 'Design Technology' as our focus for the spring term and details of a gifted and able workshop will be announced shortly.
