Comments on how the school could be improved:

١.

- I think this school is great, maybe needs a little improvement with communication
- Informing parents of PE days.
- The use of dojo as a better form of communication
- Communication can be last minute e.g. about events in school/children needing something. There is no communication when there is staff change making it difficult to support or prepare your child as you're not aware. Limited use of photos/blog for KS1 compared to others.
- Communication is hard to keep up with and follow-last school used Dojo, and it was amazing to chat with teachers keep up to date with the latest information. I find the emails on the other app hard to follow.
- Classroom Wishlists' for every class to post a termly Wishlists for donation of books/items/magazines/art materials needed to support teachers and reduce school plus personal expenditure for topics/projects that term and helps families to stay involved with what the children are doing at school.
- Someone answering the phone more on reception, always seems to go to answerphone sadly
- Teachers supporting all children & addressing any concerns before a parents evening as it makes the parent feel awful when the parent evening is all negative even though the child is succeeding.
- More staff presence during drop-offs and pick up
- Communication is sometimes last minute.
- Better communication, or on the App have a messaging service that parents can respond or query.
- Could listen more to parents.
- When something like trips or things that are needed to be brought in. It would be great if we had more reminders leading up to it so they can't be forgotten about

St Stephens Reply:

Thank you for your valuable feedback — we truly appreciate your honesty and suggestions. We're excited to share that we've been accepted by County to be a pilot school for a Parental Engagement Project aimed at strengthening communication and collaboration with families. - Better neurodivergent awareness
- Having the children in the right age group classes as it seems the children put with the younger year group are suffering in, they're learning development.
- I personally don't feel supported by the SEND provision which I think could be greatly improved.

- More teaching assistants to help support in class.
- Staff ratio
- Peer relationships
- A classroom dedicated to disruptive students with a staff member monitoring could improve learning. In said classroom, the students should be made to sit through lessons on behaviour before returning to their classrooms. Hopefully this would discourage future disruption if made to sit through the same monotonous lesson on behaviour. My child feels their learning is being disturbed constantly by noise levels in their classroom.

St Stephens Reply:

A few comments have raised important points around support and provision, which we appreciate. We are very proud of our inclusivity and strive to support a wide range of SEND needs within our school with adapted teaching. Our SENDCo works tirelessly across three days each week to ensure the best possible support for pupils with additional needs, while also guiding staff and shaping classroom practice. We recognise there is always room to strengthen communication with families and are reviewing how we can improve this further. We regularly reflect on class groupings to ensure children are in the best environment for their stage of learning. While national declines in pupil numbers are impacting school budgets and staffing ratios, we remain committed to clear communication, strong relationships, and high expectations for all pupils, irrespective of the class structure.

Staffing challenges do exist, but we continue to explore ways to maximise in-class support and deliver targeted interventions where they're most needed. We are also committed to maintaining calm, respectful classrooms where consistent behaviour expectations help all children to focus and succeed. As a Gold Rights Respecting School, we place great value on peer relationships and wellbeing. These are woven into our curriculum and pastoral care, ensuring every child feels safe, valued, and included.

III.

- Perhaps extra after school activities like Basketball/Dance groups
- Increased activities during school hours e.g. more trips
- Increased range of after school clubs. Breakfast club to start earlier.
- After school clubs within each term that include all year groups.
- After-school clubs are now sparse and do not always cover all year groups.
- Sometimes the information regarding activities after school do not include enough information in order to make an informed decision on whether to give permission.
- Few more after schools accessible for more year groups.
- Slightly earlier breakfast club for parents who start work earlier or work further afield. 0730 or even 0745 would help massively to myself who has to attend 0900 lectures in Plymouth.
- Amount of after school clubs has dwindled a little.
- Possibly more clubs for younger children.
- More accessible after school activities for those a bit further away.
- More sporting activities with other schools

St Stephens Reply:

We're very proud of the wide range of opportunities we've been able to offer this year, with over 30 after-school clubs running since September to date—far more than most other schools in our local community. These clubs have given children the chance to explore new interests, build confidence, and enjoy school life beyond the classroom. We recognise that this half term has seen fewer clubs available. This is largely due to the shorter half term, several staff members being unable to commit to after-school activities for personal reasons, and limited budget available to support this provision. We're currently reviewing what we can offer after the break, and hope to provide a varied programme that includes as many year groups as possible. We are constantly applying for grants and requesting funding to enable enrichment opportunities via clubs and for classes.

We've also heard your suggestions for more variety, improved communication about club details, and earlier start times for breakfast club to support working families. These are all being considered as we plan ahead. We do try and attend a wide range of sporting activities with other schools however the cost of transport does impact on some events. We are always very happy to host inter school events. Transport costs do also make an impact on school trips however we must thank our wonderful PTFA for their support helping to make residentials and class trips possible. If you have any ideas or would like to offer your time to help run a club, we'd be delighted to hear from you. Your support can make a real difference.

IV.

- Poor choice of school dinners needs more normal food sausage rolls, pasties, sandwiches burgers etc It's hard enough to
 get kids to eat new things at home school dinners have definitely made this harder. We are a Cornish school; pasty should
 be served or at least sandwiches as an everyday option.
- Maybe make the school dinner menu a bit simpler, sometimes they get a bit too creative and picky children don't like it
- Make Room for packed lunch eaters to eat indoors in winter

St Stephens Reply:

We understand how important it is for children to enjoy their food and feel comfortable during lunch. Our school follows a nutritionally balanced, planned menu to support children's health and wellbeing. We know some children find certain options unfamiliar, and we're mindful of the need for simpler, more familiar choices. Our UNICEF Steering Group is currently reviewing food provision, and we're in regular discussions with our catering provider to ensure meals remain appealing and accessible, while

still meeting nutritional standards. Suggestions such as including more traditional favourites and regional items like Cornish pasties are appreciated and will be shared as part of this ongoing work.

We'd also like to clarify that we always provide indoor space for packed lunch eaters during the colder months to ensure all children are comfortable at lunchtime.
