School Improvement- Remote Learning Consultation

The Department of Education has asked that schools must have a remote teaching contingency plan ready by the end of September, according to new government guidance. The Department for Education says it expects schools to give pupils access to high-quality remote resources, and to provide printed resources such as textbooks and workbooks to pupils without internet access. "Where a class, group or small number of pupils need to self-isolate, or there is a local lockdown requiring pupils to remain at home, we expect schools to have the capacity to offer immediate remote education," the guidance says. At St Stephen's we are putting together a contingency plan should schools be asked to close again. We will also endeavor to provide home resources

should a 'bubble' be closed temporarily or should your child be at home isolating but not unwell for 14 days. Our contingency plans will be sequenced in a way that is linked to the school's curriculum expectations. Many thanks to you who have completed the online survey to express your preferences for your children on home-learning programmes –this will shape what we offer so your needs can be catered for as best we can.
