This week in school we have been focusing on **Article 14** of the Convention on the Rights of a Child: *'Every child has the right to think and believe what they want and to practise their religion, as long as they are not stopping other people from enjoying their rights.'*

We had our Level 1 Assessment Day on Thursday 30th November and we are pleased to announce that Jilly, our assessor, awarded us with Level 1 of the Rights Respecting Schools Award! Jilly was impressed with the range of evidence that our Steering Group had assembled over the past 18 months, as well as how our school

environment, and curriculum, reflects a commitment to promoting children's rights. The members of the Steering Group took Jilly on a 45-minute learning walk of the school to explain this evidence to her.

Jilly visited every classroom to ask the pupils a range of questions about their rights, including their knowledge of the Convention and whether they felt our school was successfully promoting their rights. Every class was welcoming to Jilly and answered her questions in a considerate, respectful and positive manner. Two groups of pupils from across both Key Stages also met with Jilly during the afternoon to answer some very thought-provoking questions, which they did brilliantly. Jilly commented on the excellent responses from pupils', as well as the positive feedback she received from staff and governors.

Huge congratulations to the members of the Steering Group who have worked towards this Level 1 Award for the past two years, as well as all the pupils, staff and governors who showcased St Stephens in such a fantastic way on the day. As a school, we should be very proud of our efforts and hard work.

The Steering Group will no longer meet every three weeks, however, the members will still remain in their role. They will continue to ensure that we are referring to and using our school and class charters, as well as keeping a record of lessons and discussions which take place regarding children's rights. Members will reconvene to take new visitors on learning walks of our school, explaining to them how we became a 'Rights Respecting School.' We will be continuing with our 'Rights Child of the Week', as well as focusing on a particular article from the Convention on a weekly basis.

The 'Rights Child of the Week' over the past two weeks has been:

Harper (Year F) for completing lots of English and Maths learning during her 'Busy Learning' and lunchtimes. Hayden (Year 3) for independently writing a piece for the Christmas Carol Concert.

Well done to Harper and Hayden and all the children who were nominated by their class over the past two weeks!

Can we remind everyone that our last day is Wednesday 20th December and we return Monday 8th January.




Surprise visitors!

Many thanks to the children and parents for turning up on a cold Saturday afternoon to play!


