UNICEF

This week in school we have been focusing on **Article 29** of the Convention on the Rights of a Child: *'Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures, and the environment.'*

Your child will be bringing home a copy of their 'Class Charter' for you to see. These charters were created by the pupils and are reviewed on a regular basis. They can also be viewed on our school website.

Our 'Steering Group' will be undertaking a 'Narrative Walk' of the school next week to assess how UNICEF, 'Rights Respecting Language' and charters are displayed and how prominent they are across the school. The information collected from this narrative walk will be used as evidence towards our Level 1 Award.

We are continuing to focus on our 'Rights Children of the Week' this term.

The 'Rights Child of the Week' over the past two weeks has been:

- **Lilly (Year 1)** for looking after class mates when they fall over at playtimes.
- **Scott (Year 4)** for welcoming a new child to the school and helping him settle in.

Maths Challenge Day at St Stephens Community Academy

On Friday 21st April 4 schools from the Andaras Academy Trust: Windmill Hill, North Petherwin, Werrington and St Stephens, joined together to participate in an amazing Maths Challenge Day at St.Stephens Community Academy. Daniel Simons, from the Cornwall and Devon Maths Hub, enthused the pupils in their learning of maths through a range of games and challenges. The challenges included making an origami Jackson Cube, calculating the code to open the treasure chest and trying to find out the sequence required to perform a maths card trick. "It was a great day- learning maths and spending time with children from the other schools." "Today was the most fantastic maths we have done." Class 6 pupils (St.Stephens Community Academy).

Fidget Spinners

We understand that some children are coming to school with Fidget Spinners. We kindly ask that children do not come into school with these items. The reasons are that children will play with a fidget spinner by spinning it in their hand or putting it down and watching it spin on a table or the floor, producing a low ball-bearing whirr.

Although these gadgets are advertised to help children relax and to 'fiddle' to relieve stress. We have found children are distracted by this toy as it makes it difficult for them to focus and concentrate on their learning. For the pupil who is using the spinner, they focus on the gadget itself, and not their learning.

We therefore ask parents to ensure these are kept at home to enjoy and not brought to school. Children who bring them into the classroom will have them removed and handed back at the end of the day.
