On Thursday 2nd November, we were lucky enough to have Ally from Total Energy Solutions come and talk to us in year 2 and KS2. We discussed how technology has evolved through history and what the world around us would look like if there had never been engineering. Ally explained that the first ever interactive toy contained more technology than the first space shuttle used in the Apollo mission to the moon. The children were excited to discover that planes and cars are now being developed that can travel without the need for a driver or pilot. However, would they be trusting enough to ride in one? The children were not so sure! The importance of using renewable energy was expressed along with how to save energy in our own homes and the impact this will have on the future of our planet. When asked what they had learnt, one child said "I learnt that today will never happen again as the future is always changing!"


