Year 2 Visit to Eden





St Stephens children were on the front row and very much on display – and they certainly lived up to the occasion in terms of the commitment, concentration and knowledge of the music that they showed. We also had a few surprises, with children volunteering to dance, take on solo roles (Evie) and play instrumental solos (Oscar on drums). The icing on the cake came when St Stephens won an award : the Cornish Singing Schools Award, which acknowledges the enthusiasm, effort and time dedicated to singing and music at our school. Reading Karate Bands



This week our Reading Karate bands arrived at school. This is a new whole school incentive to encourage the children to read at home. The more you read, the quicker you move up the bands. Each week we add that week's number of reads onto a

running total. When children reach different milestones for the number of reads they have completed and had signed by an adult, they receive a different coloured Karate band. The children need to bring in to school their current band to swap for their new band. When the children reach black they keep their black band and start collecting from white again.
