Holiday Request

Holiday authorisation cannot be made. We can only grant it in very limited exceptional circumstances for which there is a very tight criteria such as the day of the family wedding. We cannot grant for longer extended periods. We ask kindly that parents do not discuss this with



each other as individual cases are personal and comparisons cannot be made. We further ask that this information is not shared on any social networking site. Data shows that poor attendance has a large impact of children academic performance in school and their ability to make stable friendships.

Attendance

You may have received a letter to your child's class about attendance. We track attendance on a weekly basis and we report this on our tracking systems. We celebrate attendance success in our weekly assembly and make this very visible to our children. It is vital that your child attends school regularly. If your child's attendance is below 95% then we will be in touch. We offer a breakfast club from 8am and this often helps parents with children's attendance. We do notice patterns in attendance days and children will tell us if they have been on holiday! Help your child's success at school by ensuring they have 100% attendance and are in school on time ready to learn.

Your child will now be marked as "late" if arriving after 9am and before 9.15am. Any children arriving after this time will

be marked as "unauthorised". We would also like to remind you that if your child is absent from school you are to inform the school office by 9.30am on the first day of absence.



If the school is not informed, your child's absence will be marked as "unauthorised".

Safety

Please can we remind parents to not stand around by the train at the end of the day as this is the area for teachers to safely dismiss children. Also we have noticed children running through our car park. Please ensure children walk to school safely with you along the paths. You may have seen Mrs Saunders and Mr Wilson blocking the car park. This is because the car park can be a dangerous place and is only for staff and permitted vehicles. Future checks will be taking place.

Outdoor Learning

We now have six very friendly hens, who are currently laying about four eggs a day – hopefully, soon to be six! We are going to hold our first egg sale on Friday 13th



October from the YF steps area at 3:15pm. Six eggs will cost \pounds 1 and this will go towards the cost of their food.

So far the chickens have played a part in terms of children learning about their care, observing what they do, and in art sessions. We have lots of work still to come, relating to maths (for instance costs and cage dimensions) and writing (for example story characters and poetry). All children will be visiting the hens on our next outdoor learning day which is Thursday 19th October.
