Supporting our Healthy Development

Jasmine and Deeon from Archway Dental in Kelly Bray visited us to tell us all about keeping our teeth clean and the importance of oral healthy.

They explained that there are 6 steps to healthy teeth: 1. Brush your teeth twice a day (once in the morning and once at night)

2. Brush them for 2 minutes each time.

3. Use a pea-size amount of toothpaste.

4. Do not rinse after brushing your teeth (as this will wash away the fluoride).

5. Do not eat or drink sugary things between meals.6. Visit the dentist twice a year.

They also gave us all a goodie bag with everything we need to keep out teeth clean and healthy.

What fantastic support from our local community -life skills are such a vital part of our curriculum at St Stephens.





Year 5 London Residential 2022

We had a fantastic residential trip to London this year. Year 5 started our visit at Trafalgar Square then walked down the Mall, stopped for lunch in St James park and then walked the rest of the Mall to see Buckingham Palace. Then we walked past West-

minster Abbey to our UK Parliament. We toured the Palace of Westminster seeing both Houses of Commons and Lords in session. After our tour, we then had a workshop on the



democratic process by the Parliament Education team where we elected MPs and formed a new government! Finally, at the end of our visit we were visited by Scott Mann MP for North Cornwall who talked to the children about what his job is and then took questions from the class. This was a unique opportunity which we have not had before.

After Parliament, we travelled to our accommodation before stepping out once again to go for dinner at Pizza Express on Baker Street.

Tuesday, after a good night's sleep, we walked across Kensington Gardens, looked at Kensington Palace, then The Albert memorial and the Royal Albert Hall before arriving at the Natural History Museum. The Natural History Museum is huge but we visited the dinosaur hall, mammals, the Earth Hall and also the recently returned Dippy

exhibition. There were lots of fascinating exhibits and everyone had their own favourites. Mr. Gilbert and I were particularly fascinated by the slice of a 1500 year old tree. After the museum, we had a final visit which was the London Eye.

In Year 6 we have been voting on the capabilities and reflecting on how as a class we interact and approach learning -and explaining our choices with Mrs. Brewer.





We voted to work on relationship and leadership skillsworking in groups to agree questions to ask to rebuild a 'palace'. This involved working with people that we do not normally work with and learning how to manage our feelings within this activity.



World Music Day

Our Year 2 and Year 6 pupils took part in a zoom call with Emerald School in Nigeria, to celebrate World Music Day. Sandyhill from St Austell also joined us. We each performed two songs and then taught one to our partner school. It was an incredible to hear children in West Africa singing Hidden Parts of Cornwall, alternating the verses with us!

We also learned a song from the children in Nigeria in Yoruba-one of the Nigerian languages. St Stephens children represented the school brilliantly-well done to them all-what a great opportunity this has been.
