We have recently had poor attendance at school with all but one class being below 95%. We work towards the target for each pupil at 97.5%. Please ensure that your child's attendance is 95% or above. If your child falls below 90%, the Education Welfare Officer will pick this up and will issue you a warning letter. Please do remember that holiday authorisation cannot be made. Even if you did not book the holiday and it was accidently booked by someone else. Please let all your family know this. We can only grant term-time absence in very limited exceptional circumstances, for which there is a very tight criteria. We ask kindly that parents do not discuss this with each other as individual cases are personal and comparisons cannot be made.

Lost Property


Please can parents ensure that all items (e.g. bags, uniform, bottles etc.) are clearly marked with your child's name. This helps staff keep lost property to a minimum.

Pupil Premium—Are you eligible?

It has recently come to our attention that people who qualify for PPG are not necessarily applying. This has an impact on the school, as for each PPG child on-roll, our school receives additional funding. This is to help the child in school, allowing them to access trips, breakfast club, new uniform and supports learning as well as free school meals. So as you can see it is really worthwhile!
