Dear Parent(s),

Class 5 Trip to London

We are pleased to inform you that we have now confirmed the final details for Class 5's trip to London.

We will be leaving at 6am on Wednesday 8th May and returning the following day, Thursday 9th May, at about 10pm.

We have worked very hard to get you the best price and I am pleased to let you know that it has come in under our initial estimate of £100. It is £91 per child. This includes transport, cost of activities, insurance and full board overnight accommodation. We are very grateful to the Government as they will fund a large majority of our transport due to us visiting The Houses of Parliament.

Because of the adjustment in price it means that we now just require £31 by Monday 1st April (if you have already paid £60), thanks to the fantastic fundraising and some bargaining.

I now need you to read the information attached and fill in the appropriate forms. This includes:

- Insurance Form
- Contact details, medical information and dietary needs
- Itinerary for London Trip
- Kit List

The dietary part of the form only needs to be completed if your child is vegetarian or suffers from any food allergies.

We would be grateful if you would complete the forms and return them to school by Friday 5th April.

If your child needs to take medication when he/she is with us, please make sure it is clearly labelled with your child's name and dosage details. The medication should be placed in a named plastic bag or box and sealed. This must be handed to us on the morning of our departure. Asthma inhalers should be placed in your child's small rucksack (day bag) which will stay with them at all times during the stay.

Finally, we would like to invite you to a parents meeting on:

Monday 1st April at 3.20pm (in Class 5)

We look forward to seeing you then. However, in the meantime, if you have any queries relating to this trip please do not hesitate to contact me at school.

- Breakfast @ 08:00.
- 09:00 Travel by coach to Houses of Parliament.
- 10:00 Houses of Parliament for workshop and tour. (finish 12:15)
- 12:30 Lunch outside the London Eye.
- London Eye flight @ 13:30.
- Pickup by coach at London Eye for return to school.
- Estimated arrival back at school: 2200 Hrs (stop at a service station for tea).

London Residential Trip: Kit List

Dress code

The children are allowed to wear non-school uniform for the duration of the trip but they need to be comfortable and prepared for cold and wet weather. We recommend that they wear trousers, a t-shirt, a jumper/fleece and shoes or trainers (waterproof). Children are provided with lanyards, showing the school name and a variety of contact details in case of emergency.

Overnight bag (large rucksack/sports bag/small suitcase)

- □ One change of clothes trousers, t-shirt, jumper/fleece.
- □ Socks x2
- □ Underwear x2
- □ Nightwear
- □ Sleeping bag and pillowcase
- □ 1 spare pair of shoes or trainers (waterproof)
- Wash bag
 - o soap
 - o toothbrush
 - o toothpaste
 - o roll on deodorant (strictly no aerosols)
 - o hairbrush/comb
- □ 1 towel
- Small torch
- Optional: reading book
- □ Optional: teddy

Day bag (small rucksack)

- □ Waterproof coat
- Packed lunch in a plastic bag <u>not</u> a lunch box (if your child normally has a free school meal please notify us on the appropriate form and a packed lunch will be provided for them)
- □ Filled water bottle
- Suncream
- □ Optional: Camera (preferably disposable or a low value digital camera)
- Optional: Items to entertain themselves on the coach. This may include an MP3 player, a handheld games console or small tablet.

Other items (to be handed to an accompanying member of staff prior to departure)

- Essential: £10 for tea at a service station on the way home. This must be in a named envelope.
 We can't exactly predict which service station we will stop at, so this sum is to allow for differences in prices between places.
- □ **Medication**: Labelled with name and dosage.
- Optional: Pocket money. This must be no more than £5. To be in a named wallet/purse.
 (We may not necessarily spend this.)
- Optional: A favourite snack or treat, e.g. a pack of biscuits / raisins etc (preferably no sweets, chocolate or nuts.) Treats can be shared at designated treat / snack times. (We may not get through them all so don't be offended if we hand them back to you after the trip!)

Items Prohibited

Mobile phones, IPads, Laptops or large tablets, pocket knives, expensive cameras and aerosols.

Please clearly label all of your child's belongings. The school accepts no responsibility for lost or damaged items. Mr Hunt will collect and store all electronic items in her bedroom before bed to prevent loss of sleep!
