Drop-off and collection	<ul> <li>The window for drop-off and collection of all children will be as normal.</li> <li>AM: Gates open from 8.45am, drop-off at classroom door 8.45am – 9am.</li> <li>If your child is attending breakfast club, they will enter via the main school entrance from 8.00 a.m.</li> <li>PM: Gates open from 3.00pm, collection from classroom door, 3.05: EYFS, 3.10:KS1 &amp; 3.15: KS2 – all off site by 3.30 unless staying for clubs. If your child is attending a club they get collected from the main entrance at 4.15 p.m. unless otherwise stated.</li> <li>Pre-school is open from 9.00 and closes @ 3.00p.m. Entry through the main Pre -school door. More information on the website in the Pre-school tab under 'More Information'.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Once the gates are closed at 9.00 in the morning all children must register via the main school office.</li> <li>Your child will be registered as late if they come in after 9.10 a.m.</li> </ul>

,	Please note we will still be retaining a distance at the classroom doors to enable the children to come

	or cloakroom areas unless the teacher is with you for obvious safeguarding reasons.
	• If you need to speak to a teacher, please inform the school office or the adult on duty at the gate. They
	will then arrange a meeting or telephone call with you at a mutually convenient time. We always do
	our utmost to get in contact with you ASAP.
	Children must attend school in their school uniform.
-	• They need to bring in their <b>named PE kits</b> to remain in school, in a <b>named bag</b> . Kits will be sent home

	• A PE/Wild Tribe timetable to be shared with parents/carers on the first week back so you know when
clothes	your child will need their PE/Wild Tribe kit.
	• Old, warm and waterproof clothes will be needed on a weekly basis, in a <b>named bag</b> , for our outside
	'Wild Tribe' learning. This will go home with your child weekly to ensure it can be washed and /or

## A reminder about uniform: all pupils will need:
